We recommend vaccination in the spring and the fall, about six months apart. Eastern and Western Encephalitis, Influenza, Rhino, and West Nile should be given twice a year. Rabies should be given once a year as well as Strangles (if desired). Shaded areas indicate the recommended time of year for an average adult horse to receive each vaccination. The Coggins test and Dental Float can be performed at any time of year with the sheath cleaning performed at the time of the dental. However, we prefer to perform your horse's Dental Exam and/or Power Float during the fall months to ensure that your horse is eating and grinding his/her food properly during the harsher winter months. We recommend de-worming at approximately 8 week intervals, rotating the type of de-wormer used. For a copy of our recommended rotation for de-wormers please call or ask for a schedule.
